• Registration

Before attending any course in the College, students must be registered

- (a) as students of the College and the University of Limerick,
- (b) for the courses of study they wish to pursue.

Once students have enrolled with the College, they become members of the MIC Alumni Association automatically. Students are invited to connect with the MIC Community on the Friends and Alumni website (friends.mic.ie). Register your details on the online database to avail of the benefits of being part of this network. Benefits include the provision of College update emails and access to the Career Centre.

A new online Enrolment/Registration and payment system was introduced in the Academic Year 2014/15. You will be advised to log onto your student portal www.si.ul.ie to complete your Enrolment/Registration. You will require the following:

- Login details - Student ID number, Pin/Password (this is normally set as your date of birth and you will be prompted to change it once you are logged in)
- SUSI application number, if applicable
- Bank details - Account Number, Sort Code, IBAN and BIC numbers
- You will need to use a Debit Card or Credit Card in order to make payments

During Orientation Days you will be assisted in finalising your choice of subjects and you will have an opportunity to discuss the various subjects with relevant members of staff. Having finalised your choice, you will be assisted with online module registration during week 1. See *Lámhleabhar*/Student Handbook for information on how to register for your programme. Note: there are no elective subjects for SPC, Thurles.

• Attendance at Lectures, Tutorials and Practicals

All students are required to attend lectures, tutorials and practicals as timetabled and must take responsibility for any absences therefrom. All students are required to acknowledge and comply with directives from Professional Services and Academic staff. Any student who fails to comply with these requirements may be refused permission to sit examinations at the appointed time.

Absence through illness of 5 days or more should be reported to Student Academic Administration (Room 112). A medical certificate may be required. For students at St. Patrick's Campus please report to Paula Hourigan, Room P124. E: paula.hourigan@mic.ul.ie T: 0504 20535.

• Student Suitability for Course

In cases where a Faculty or Department has non-academic grounds to question a student's suitability for teaching, clinical or professional practice, the Vice-President for Academic Affairs or his nominee may require the student to submit an independent assessment of his/her suitability to continue to participate in his/her course of studies.

• Garda Vetting

Mary Immaculate College is registered with the Garda Vetting Unit for the provision of Garda Vetting services. In

January 2008, the College introduced Garda Vetting for all students over the age of **18 years** going on placement with children during the course of their studies at MIC.

Garda Vetting will only be conducted in respect of students between the ages of **16 years and 18 years**, predicated on the written consent of a parent or guardian, and, as such, all applications in respect of Garda Vetting must be accompanied by an appropriately completed Parent/Guardian consent form.

Application forms for Garda Vetting will be distributed to all concerned first year students on enrolment. Underage students should contact the Garda Vetting office which is located in room 112 (Student Academic Administration) of the Foundation Building to obtain Parent/Guardian consent form. Second year BA students who intend undertaking off-campus work placement(s) in setting(s) which require Garda Vetting, will be advised by the College's Placement Office and Garda Vetting Officer on the procedures to be followed. There is a €50 charge for processing Garda Vetting applications.

• Accommodation

Mary Immaculate College offers on-campus accommodation and also off-campus accommodation. A limited number of single rooms for girls only, are available in the on-campus residence. The off-campus accommodation is known as Courtbrack Student Accommodation (formerly known as Summerville Student Accommodation) and it is situated on Courtbrack Avenue, South Circular Road. Off-campus accommodation is available to all undergraduate and postgraduate students, male and female. It is approximately a 5 minute walk from the College. Its contact number is: T: +353 61 302500. There is a private development of student apartments close to the College known as Ashdown. Ashdown apartments are situated on Courtbrack Avenue, South Circular Road and the contact number is T: +353 61 442200. Accommodation is also available locally in lodgings, flats, apartments and houses. Mary Immaculate College also offers on-campus accommodation at St. Patrick's Campus, Thurles. 36 single, en-suite rooms are available primarily for first years. • Meals

Breakfast, dinner and evening meals are available in the College restaurant at reasonable rates for all students who wish to partake of them. A tea and coffee service, together with a wide variety of snacks, is available in the College restaurant throughout the day. 'Meal Deals' are available for students from Aramark. At the Thurles Campus students may purchase hot food, soup, snacks etc. in the College Refectory.

The College welcomes students of all faiths and none. The facilities of the College Chaplaincy Service are available to all students. The Chaplaincy Team strives to promote the spiritual development of the entire College community, staff and students. The team facilitates the discussion of social, spiritual and theological issues. It is possible to discuss issues of concern in confidence. The College Chaplain, Fr. Michael Wall, provides religious services, according to the Roman Catholic rite, in the College Chapel. Arrangements are in place to provide services for non-Catholic students. The Chaplaincy Service strives to support students during times of bereavement, illness and during occasions of personal or family upheaval. We honour students' joys and celebrations and work in close co-operation with the Students' Union and various societies. Be sure not to miss our coffee mornings/evenings.

Opportunities for faith sharing exists for those who wish to avail of them. The Chaplaincy team will arrange retreats and pilgrimages for students wishing to partake in such spiritual exercises. Mass is celebrated in the College Chapel every weekday, (Monday-Thursday at 13.00 and at 08.25 on Fridays). One may light a candle in the College Chapel or write a request in the Intention Book. The College Chapel and the Meditation room (behind the Chapel) are always open to students who wish to pray, reflect or just be in a quiet place. • Counselling Services

Mary Immaculate College provides a professional, on-campus Counselling Service available to all students, free of charge.

Psychological support is provided for many issues, such as: Stress, panic/anxiety attacks, crisis pregnancy, eating disorders, bereavement, exam stress, post-abortion, depression, relationships, sexual/emotional/physical abuse, gender issues, bullying, confidence / self-esteem issues, feeling suicidal, family issues, addictive behaviours, and others.

• Health Promotion

Mary Immaculate College is the first third level institution in Ireland to be designated a "Health Promoting College" and has had the service in place since 1996. The service aims to promote the health and well being of all members of the College community through policy development, the provision of programmes and activities and the implementation of specific health promotion strategies. The team includes a Student Health Promotion Officer and we work together with many of the other services and departments to highlight health related issues and events.

Students are welcome to drop-in to the office for advice and information on health related topics such as healthy eating, physical activity, mental health, quitting smoking, sexual health, alcohol and other drugs. We also stock educational resources that may be useful for students planning for teaching practice and work placement and we circulate a weekly newsletter.

EOLAS NA SLÍ / FINDING YOUR WAY AROUND MIC, LIMERICK

You are advised to acquaint yourself from the beginning with the location of the various lecture rooms and the offices of the Heads and staff of your subject departments.

All lecture rooms and offices are numbered and you should acquaint yourself with the system by taking note of the signs in the Reception area. The following is an outline of the signage system in the College.

Foundation Building (Main Building)

- All rooms beginning with G, e.g. G01, refer to the ground floor of the Foundation Building with the exception of G65 to G69 and G70, which are to the rear of the quadrangle, between the Foundation Building and the Library.
- Rooms beginning with 1, i.e. 101 are on the first floor, Foundation Building.
- Rooms beginning with 2, e.g. 204, are on the second floor, Foundation Building.
- Rooms beginning with 3, e.g. 302, are on the third floor, Foundation Building.
- All bedrooms are referred to by B numbers, e.g. B100. Access to the Residence is by the ground floor of the Foundation Building.
- Offices beginning with R are located in the Residential Block. All rooms beginning with RG, e.g. RG1, are on the ground floor of the Residential Block. Rooms beginning R1, e.g. R101, are on the first floor of the Residential Block.

Library Building (Áras an Phiarsaigh)

- All rooms beginning with L refer to the Library Building.
- Rooms beginning with LG, e.g. LG1 (Main Issue Desk) are ground floor in the Library Building.
- Rooms beginning with L1, e.g. L107, refer to mezzanine floors (not fully first floor).
- Rooms beginning with L2 are what would normally be referred to as first floor, but because of the mezzanine (between floors) are now designated second floor, e.g. L203, (AV Library).
- Where dashes exist between numbers on signs, e.g. L102 - L112, this means those specific numbers plus all those in between.

Mount (opposite South Circular Road entrance)

- All rooms beginning with M, e.g. M1, M2, etc., are located in the Mount Building, which is across the South Circular Rd., opposite the Main Gate of the College.
- The Research and Graduate School is located on the ground floor of this building.
- Early Childhood Studies is located on the second floor of this building.

Gerard House (opposite South Circular Road entrance)

- All room numbers. with N e.g. N1, N2, N3, etc. are located in Gerard House which is across the South Circular Road, opposite the Main Gate of the College.

Summerville House

- All room numbers with S, e.g. SG01, S101, S201, etc. are located in Summerville House.
- Rooms beginning with SG, e.g. SG01, are on the ground floor.
- Rooms beginning with S1, e.g. S101, are on the first floor.
- The Corporate Communications Office is located on the second floor.

Tailteann Building

Rooms beginning with TN are located in the Tailteann building. Tailteann is a multi-purpose facility and provides a leisure space for students alongside state-of-the-art teaching facilities for students in the area of Physical Education. It is located prominently along the new entrance route at Mary Immaculate College.
