

**Naughton Fellowship**

The Center for Research on Educational Opportunity (CREO) at the Institute for Educational Initiatives, University of Notre Dame, offers the Naughton Fellowship to support a visiting scholar from the island of Ireland. The Carmel and Martin Naughton Fellowship will advance the scholarly study of Catholic Education, while fostering best practice in the wider education field and promoting enduring bonds between Ireland and America.

We welcome applicants who have received or who are pursuing a doctorate and whose work is focused primarily on education, sociology, or a related social science discipline. Research Fellows will be expected to participate in the intellectual community of the Institute of Educational Initiatives and the Center for Research on Educational Opportunity to further their own intellectual development and research with the faculty and Fellows of the Institute (<http://iei.nd.edu/people/iei-fellows/>). These activities include but are not limited to participation in the Institute and CREO seminars, courses across the university campus, presentation of the Fellow's research, and working with Notre Dame faculty on specific research projects. On campus, the Naughton Fellow will have full access to the Institute's and CREO's collective resources (including computing, print and digital libraries, and administrative services). The Fellowship Award will cover travel costs, campus accommodation, office space, basic health insurance for the duration of the Fellowship, and a stipend of \$7,500. Notre Dame will assist the chosen candidate in organizing the appropriate visa.

The Naughton Fellowship will be offered for one semester of the academic year, or a comparable period of time agreed upon between the successful applicant and Notre Dame. Upon the conclusion of the Fellowship, the Naughton Fellow will submit a report of his or her research undertaken at Notre Dame and suggest ways in which the links between Ireland and Notre Dame can be fostered in the field of Catholic Education. The hope is that the experience acquired and the research done over the course of the semester will contribute to the Fellow's future academic endeavors.

The Naughton Fellow will be chosen by a selection committee comprising Institute faculty and staff. All applications must be submitted by **31st January 2016**, and the successful candidate will be notified by May 13th.
